Making the Most Out of Your Membership

- Attend At Least One Program a Month- Consistency is key when developing relationships, and the
 more your family gets to be seen and see others, the greater the likelihood that true and lasting
 friendships will be forged.
 - There are some in our community going through particularly challenging seasons (pregnancy, medical concerns, etc.), and attendance at that rate just isn't feasible. Let us know who you are so we as a community can support you; whether it's through prayer, providing meals, or just touching base every few weeks to know that you're not forgotten. Supporting on another during difficult seasons is as important to the group as it is to you.
- **Get Involved-** Whether it's joining a committee or signing up to sweep floors after an event, each of us has something to offer.
 - Take a quick inventory of your special gifts and talents and those of your family members. How
 can those gifts and talents be used to help support the programming efforts of Catholic Family
 Adventure Club?
 - If you don't have a lot of time to spare outside of regular attendance at events, no worries.
 Perhaps you can sign up to come a few minutes early or stay a few minutes late and help with clean-up?
- **Get Out of Your Comfort Zone-** Take advantage of more subdued events, such as park days and potluck dinners, to meet and get to know new families.

With such a larger community, it is understandable that many children will already know each other from other cross-sections of the community, and it's very easy for children and teens especially to put off the "closed group" vibe without meaning to.


