### Wisdom for the Way

an interview with Monse Gomez

We are all on different pages of our homeschool journey and it's always nice to hear how our fellow families go about the task of education. Our Montserrat Gomez has been on this journey for a few years and has shared some of her wisdom and encouragement with our community.

## 1. What is something you prioritize at the start of the new year?

"One priority for me at the start of a new school year was to attend Mass and ask the priest for a blessing. In the weeks leading up to the new year, I had already gathered the books, printed the syllabus, and prepared my weekly calendar. Staying organized and planning ahead are essential to homeschooling."





### 2. What do you do to keep yourself and your children motivated on tough days?

"What I learned in my early years of homeschooling is that having and maintaining a good relationship with your child is of greater importance—and more valuable—than academics. On tough days, we would take a break and go for a walk, get ice cream, or play in the backyard. Sometimes I needed that time off too, because we all have those high-stress days. Taking those breaks helped us maintain a strong and beautiful relationship."

# 3. What criteria do you take into account before selecting a curriculum?

"From the beginning, I wanted a curriculum that would help me form both the soul and the mind of my son. My goal was never to focus on academics as much as on good formation. Other homeschool moms had shared with me their regret over jumping from one curriculum to another, which only made things harder for themselves and their children, so I took their advice into account when choosing a classical curriculum. From my research, the program that best aligned with my goals was Mother of Divine Grace, and we stayed with it throughout our entire homeschooling journey."




## 4. What would you tell a new-to-homeschooling or soon-to-be homeschooling family?

"To new homeschooling moms, I would say: enjoy and cherish the honor of educating and forming your children. It is such an amazing season of life. Take them to Mass as often as possible and spend time before the Blessed Sacrament. I truly believe that I only did 1% and God did the other 99%. I prayed for the graces, wisdom, and strength to homeschool my son, and the

Lord provided far more than I ever expected. Along this journey, you will grow alongside your children, come to know them more deeply, and develop a beautiful relationship with them. Forming good children for the Kingdom of God is our number one goal, and it should remain our main focus. May God bless you on your homeschool journey!"

### Michaelmas; The Feast of the Archangels

### September 29



- This feast highlights St. Michael, St. Raphael and St. Gabriel; however, its origins lie in remembering St. Michael's victory over Satan in the battle for Heaven.
- It was a Church Holyday until the 18<sup>th</sup> Century.
- The name is pronounced "micklemus"
- Old legends ties the feast to blackberries. They claim Satan fell from heaven into a blackberry bush. Traditionally, people have celebrated with a dish involving blackberries.
- Bannock bread is the traditional cake linked to the holiday; it originated in Scotland.




