Welcome to our new section of the newsletter! We want to bring resources, ideas, feast day reminders, and liturgical living right to you in our monthly newsletter.

This month is the month of Mary. Catholics have long honored Mary throughout the month of May. There are some special feast days this month honoring Mary whose example of patience, peace, and trust can inspire all of us.

Below you will find some ideas to help you live liturgically as a family!

- May crowning- This can take place at a parish or your home. All it takes is a statue of Mary and a crown to place on her head, usually made of flowers.
- Our Lady of Fatima- Our Lady's main message was to return to prayer. Pray a family rosary or make your own rosary on this feast day.
- The Ascension- You can fly a kite, look at the clouds, take a walk outside, or make a sweet treat with meringue that looks like clouds.
- The Visitation-Pray the Magnificat as a family or visit a pregnant friend.
