Welcome CFAC Families


As fall slowly graces us with cooler temperatures, we're excited to present our second newsletter.


Community Corner




Our first service activity took place September 22nd at St. Mary Magdalene as we assembled hygiene bags that contained soap, shampoo, toothpaste and toothbrushes. The bags were stuffed in record time as everyone's enthusiasm and competitive spirit emerged. Based on the laughter and smiles, it appeared everyone had a good time as they worked on a project that truly makes a difference in people's lives. As people utilize the resources of St. Mary Magdalene Food Pantry, these bags are an added benefit to meet the needs of those who may not have the means to focus on oral hygiene as a priority. Moving forward our teens and tweens have the freedom to expand on what can be included in the bags, and they can use their creativity to raise funds for the supplies. One thing any family member can do at their leisure is to make small notes to include in the bags with encouraging notes, for example "Have a nice day" or "God loves you" or even just a drawing. Many of the recipients are elderly folks with little contact with others, and it would be meaningful to receive a handwritten note or picture included in the bags. Our next meeting to assemble more bags will be October 27th and again on November 17th.

Our next scheduled tween and teen event will be a service project at Elijah's Retreat in Jacksonville on October 21st. Elijah's Retreat is a safe place for families facing autism to go and enjoy activities that include camping, horseback riding, and enjoying the outdoors. We will be there from 9am-1pm to help with projects that involve manual labor, so it is recommended to wear tennis shoes or boots and clothes that can get a little dirty.

Many times when performing service projects for others, the result is that the ones performing the activity benefit as much as those they are attempting to help. It is a blessing to have the capacity to make this world a better place, actively working as the "hands" of Jesus. Pair that with having a good time with friends, and it doesn't get better than that. 


